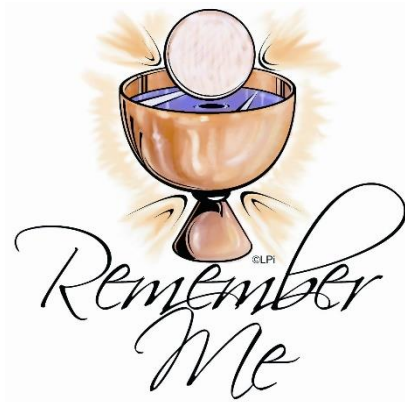
LUKE 22:19 (NKJV)

We're glad that you're here to worship with us. You are encouraged to stand or be seated during the liturgy, whichever is convenient and comfortable.

During the 7:30 p.m. service, while the Closing Hymn is sung and Psalm 22 is recited, the altar will be stripped as a visual, symbolic reminder of the events that lie in our Lord's future.

The congregation will leave in silence.

On This Holy Day, we remember with thanksgiving the new and deeper meaning that our Lord gave to the bread and wine of the Passover meal. Please be reminded that through this Sacrament comes the promise of the forgiveness of our sins and life with God which began at our Baptism and continues forever. It's for that reason that this meal is an occasion for joy and celebration. Lutherans believe that every time we gather around this meal of grace that the real presence of Jesus comes near—that His power and love are in our midst, in just the same way as those gifts and His presence were with His disciples in the upper room. Trinity Lutheran Church (and most Lutheran Churches worldwide) has an “*Open Communion Policy*”, which means that we invite all baptized Christians who would normally receive the Sacrament in their own congregation to join us in receiving it here.
