THE VIGIL OF EASTER
Saturday, March 30, 2024 – 7:30 P.M.

Welcome to the “Vigil of Easter”, one of the most ancient services in Christendom. As last night’s Tenebrae Service ended in darkness, so does this evening’s service begin that way.

The climax of what began on Maundy Thursday is reached in this service, which is full of contrasts between darkness and light, death and life, chaos and order, slavery and freedom. The cross is vindicated as the Lord’s throne, and the fullness of salvation finds expression. Through the Word, the Sacraments are revealed as the means of God’s salvation.

Four sections comprise the Vigil of Easter. The Service of Light, The Service of Readings, The Order for Holy Baptism, and The Celebration of Holy Communion.

The Service of Light begins with the lighting of the Christ Candle. The opening prayers remind us that ‘this is the night’ when Christians remember and celebrate God’s activity to rescue us.

The Service of Readings from the Old Testament recalls God’s action as the Creator and the Restorer of Life - as He rescued His people and renewed their relationship with Him.

Remembering the Sacrament of Holy Baptism reminds us that in this Sacrament, we are joined to the death and resurrection of Christ our old self is ‘drowned’ and we are then ‘raised up’ to new life. In the ancient church, this was the only service of the year at which Baptisms took place. We use tonight’s service as an opportunity to remember our own Baptismal vows. **The Service of Holy Communion** starts with the announcement of the resurrection, and the celebration begins!

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT

Pastor: Dear friends in Christ: On this most holy night in which our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life, the church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which, by hearing His Word and celebrating His Sacraments, we share in His victory over death.

*After the Christ Candle is lit, it is brought into
the Sanctuary, at which time the following is said:*

Pastor: May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.
Congregation: Amen.

As the Christ Candle is carried to its position in the chancel, we will pause 3 times to say the following:

Pastor: The light of Christ,
Congregation: **Thanks be to God.**

THE EASTER PROCLAMATION

Pastor: Rejoice now, heavenly hosts and choirs of angels; rejoice now all creation; sound out, trumpet of salvation and celebrate the triumph of our King.

Rejoice, O Church, clothed in the brightness of this light. Let this house ring out with rejoicing, with the praises of God's people.

To all of you who stand near this marvelous and holy light, join with me, I ask you, in praising the loving kindness of Almighty God; through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and rules with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Congregation: Amen.

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

Congregation: And also with you.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

Congregation: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Pastor: It is indeed right and salutary that we should always and everywhere, with our whole heart and mind and voice, sing praise to You, the invisible, almighty, and eternal God, and Your only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord; for He is the true Paschal Lamb, who at the feast of the Passover, paid for us the debt of Adam's sin, and by His blood, delivered Your faithful people.

Pastor: This is the night in which, in ancient times, you brought our forebearers, the children of Israel, out of bondage in Egypt, and led them through the Red Sea on dry land.

This is the night in which the darkness of sin has been taken away by the rising brightness.

This is the night when all who believe in Christ are rescued from evil and the gloom of sin, and are renewed in grace and are restored to holiness.

This is the night when Christ broke the bonds of death and hell, and rose victorious from the grave.

This is the night which shines like the day, when wickedness is put to flight and sin is washed away.

This is the night in which innocence is restored to the fallen and joy to those who mourn.

Evil is humbled; discord is banished, and peace is offered to all the world.

This is the night when earth and heaven are joined and we are reconciled to God.

We pray, therefore, Holy Father, that this candle, lighted to the honor of Your name, may continue to burn brightly and dispel all the darkness of our night.

May Christ, the Morning Star which never sets, find it ever burning—He who gives light to all creation and who lives and reigns forever and ever.

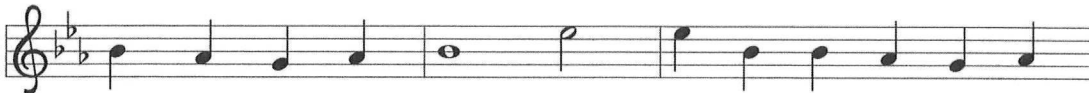

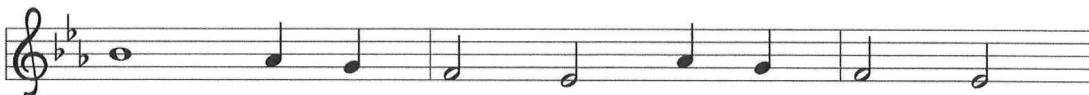

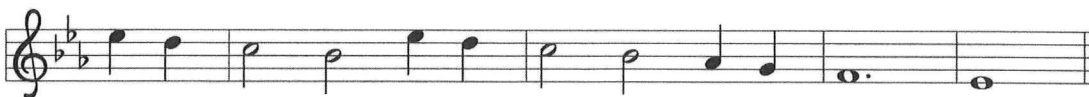

REMEMBERING OUR BAPTISM

- Pastor: Dear Friends in Christ:
As the people of God who are gathered together by the Holy Spirit, we confess as a church that we are buried with Christ by Baptism into His death, and raised with Him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, now that our Lenten observance is ended, to remember the promises of Holy Baptism.
- Pastor: The Lord be with you.
Congregation: And also with you.
- Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
Congregation: It is right to give Him thanks and praise.
- Pastor: We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

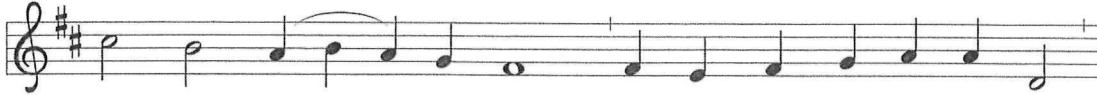
